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Background:

Children are the future of our country. We need to shape and mould them properly. Saathi has strongly felt the need to give them proper guidance and love to help them build good characters for their future. Social obstacles such as lack of education, lack of social awareness, poverty and domestic violence have often left permanent negative imprints on the children. In such situations the child is deprived of motherly love and proper parental guidance that they rightfully deserve.

In this regard, Saathi expanded its program and a new shelter for 18 girls was established in February 2008, with support from Crystal Kids. The shelter's objective is to help these needy children be able to live in a regular and amiable ambience. They receive guidance and attention from the Supervisor, Wardens, Field worker and Counselor at the shelter to help them change the direction that their lives were previously taking.

The shelter has been able to set up various activities and programs for the children. Saathi has given much importance to providing the children with formal education, extra curricular activities, regular meetings for the children with their parents/guardians and also counseling when necessary.

Routine group discussions take place among Saathi staff where further efforts are made to plan the future of the child regarding their education or further training to help them be able to live an independent life.

Intake Report

They were total 18 intakes in the shelter this year. Among them 10 were rescued directly from the street, 3 were referred from SAATHI Women Shelter, 1 was referred from Shakti Samuha (an organization working for trafficked victims), 1 from Women Police Cell, and 2 from Social Workers. 4 children referred to the shelter were street children, 9 were victims of domestic violence, 3 had sick parents who were unable to take care of their children, 1 was sexually abused and 1 was conflict affected.

Education Report

Among the 18 girls in the shelter at present, 16 are admitted in a boarding school, 1 is admitted in a government school and 1 of them is just 2 years old and does not go to school.

Our supervisor and warden have been conducting weekly visits to the school to review their progress and meet with their respective teachers. The children had their first term examination in July and second term in November.

A tutor has been hired to help them with their homework after school. The tutor comes to the shelter daily from 4:30-6:30pm. All the staff members are making serious efforts to help them in their studies.

Most of the children are having difficulty with English, therefore this year we are planning to hire an English language teacher to come everyday in the morning to facilitate their English language.

Medical Report:

The children receive regular medical checkups through health camps organized by Saathi. This year the medical check up was organized in July where Doctor Samundra Bajimaya examined all the girls.

Medicine for the prevention of worms and various vitamins are regularly distributed at the Shelter. The shelter has equipped first aid boxes and competent staff who are trained to perform first aid, if need arises. Expert opinion on adding nutritional food to the present diet is also taken from time to time.

Children who reach serious stages of any illness or who are badly injured are taken to different government Hospitals.

Extracurricular Activities:

The shelter tries to include a variety of activities to entertain and educate the children all year round:

- **Dance Classes** - The children take Nepali, Hindi and English dance classes with volunteers and staff. They performed at Saathi's program and in DAV school.
- **Art and Craft and Cooking Class** - The children were also given art and craft and cooking class in the shelter itself by volunteers.
- **Educational Field Trip:** The children are taken on a regular basis to visit places like Noodles Company, Patan Durbar Square, Bhaktapur Durbar Square, Dakshinkali Temple, etc. They are also taken on nature trips and picnics.
- **Festivals:** The children celebrate festivals like Dashain, Tihar, Christmas, Holi, New Year and Shivaratri. They are taught about the different religions and how to respect and follow them equally. The staff celebrates the festivals with them by preparing cultural programmes, special meal and distributing gifts and new clothes.
- **Movies** - The children are taken to the movies regularly. They also watch movies every Saturday and on public holidays in the shelter itself.
- **Sports:** Girls participate in different sports activities inside and outside the shelter. Similarly children also participated and won medals in their annual sports day program organized in their school.
- **Annual Picnic:** All the children and the staffs were taken to the Annual picnic on 29th of March to Godawari. They were also taken to Botanical Garden where they enjoyed seeing various flowers and plants. Different games for the children were organized on that day e.g. running, running by one leg, spoon and marble race, etc. Winners were also provided with prizes. Game for staff members was also organized. They also enjoyed music and danced to Nepali & Hindi Songs.
- **Other programs:** Warden and Volunteers from different colleges and organizations also arranged for games and competitions for the children residing in the shelter.

Awareness Raising Programme

SAATHI shelter periodically provides the children with various awareness raising programmes on the following issues:

- Anger Management
- Health and Hygiene
- Child Sexual Abuse
- Family Values
- Domestic Violence
- Value Education

These programmes are conducted by coordinator, supervisor, counselors, volunteers and the SAATHI staff. These programmes have helped the children to grow in their capacity of expressing their feelings and have helped them to value the support and guidance that SAATHI is providing. After such programmes, the children usually express what they have learnt and understood. SAATHI hopes to bring in more people to continue such activities for the children.

Annual Counseling Report

All the children residing in the shelter received Counseling services to help them to change their behavior, become self confident, improve their decision making power, manage their problems, overcome psychological and emotional problems and feel and understand the concept of a family and its values. According to the need and nature of the problem, individual counseling, group counseling, parenting counseling, family counseling, guidance as well as awareness training was given to them.

Methods

While counseling, more emphasis was given in rapport building, trust building, listening, and focusing on their feelings. Counseling was very successful to help them overcome psychological problems. However we do not believe in making children dependent, therefore counseling was provided only to children who had serious problems. We conducted:

1. Individual Counseling for 3 children
2. Group Counseling for 17 children
3. Family Counseling for 11 families
4. Peer Counseling for 6 residents

Problem:

Behaviour problem (aggressiveness, obsession and compulsion, lying, attention seeking), bed wetting, anxiety/stress, depression and psychiatric problem related to hyperactivity were some of the problems seen in the children

Counseling structure and system

In order to provide service to the child to help him through certain problems a certain step was ascertained during the counseling process.

1. **Identify** the present complain of a child in need of psychosocial intervention
2. **Assess** and gather information through interview, observation, psychological test and tools, play and drawing.
3. **Intervene** through different mode such as individual, group, family and peer counseling.

Staff Capacity Building:

- Hostel Warden participated in a 5 Days mediation training given by Mahendra Prasain on 21 -26 August at hotel paradise, Jyatha.
- First Aid training for the residential staffs was given on 17 - 18 August at Boys Shelter.
- All the staff took First Aid Training on 17th and 18th August at Saathi Boys Shelter.
- Outreach worker attended 3 days training on 'Child Protection and Participation' organized by CWIN from August 15 - 17, 2008. The training focused on issues regarding Child Rights Convention, Child Protection, Child labor exploitation, Child Participation, etc.
- Warden Bam Bahadur Thapa attended 3 days training on First Aid at SAATHI Boys Shelter on August 17 - 19, 2008.
- Warden took 5 days 'Mediation Training' organized by SAATHI on August 26 - 31, 2008. Mahendra Prasain gave the training.
- Field Worker attended 10 days training on 'Social Worker Training' at Budhanilkantha organized by UNICEF and NAOS (National Alliance of Street Children) on September 17 - 26, 2008. Staff of NAOS and social workers from various organizations was among the trainers.
- Counselor attended 6 days training on counseling skills from September 14 - 19th 2008. The training focused on play therapy, kinesiology, etc.

Note: The staff also participated in various workshops and seminars organized by different organization on issues related to children.

Outreach Report

The children are encouraged to go to their homes and reunite with their families. Similarly family assessment visit was also conducted for 16 children residing in the shelter. Outreach workers are also on the lookout for needy children who require shelter after its expansion.

Meetings in the shelter

Staff meeting takes place every week in the shelter. Every week staff meeting is conducted to make the action plan of weekly activity. In the meetings staff members set up their weekly plan for the coming week and share the following week's work report. Every staff in the shelter participates in this meeting. Important issued are also discussed during these meeting.

Similarly the supervisor conducts children meeting once every two weeks. The children share issues concerned to them during these meetings.

Case meetings are also held among the supervisor, counselor and the outreach worker to facilitate decisions regarding education and follow up.

Networks and Alliances:

Saathi is also an active member of different network of NGO's working for the cause of children. These networks help to strengthen NGO partnerships and exchange experience of sharing and learning. The members of these networks meet from time to time to discuss the problems the children are facing and how to tackle them. Various workshops and seminars also take place on a regular basis. Among various networks Saathi is an active member of CZOP (Children Zone of Peace) and National Alliance of Street children.

Individual Progress Report of Children residing in the shelter

1. Name: Sabina and Sajina BK

Educational & Extra Curricular Assessment:

Sabina and Sajina are real sisters and they both study in class nursery. Both of them are good in studies. Sabina secured 97.33% in the first term and 98% in the second term whereas Sajina secured 98.66% in the first term and 98% in the second term. There is no complain from the teachers but Sabina at times is careless and naughty in class unlike her sister Sajina who is always well disciplined.

Family Assessment:

Her mother has left the woman shelter and is working as an office helper in a manpower office. Her legal case with her husband has also been settled and she now gets 50% of her husband's salary. She now stays with her son and she is also thinking of getting re-married. She took her daughters for 2 days in the Dashain Holiday. However she has not even visited them in the Winter Holidays. A meeting with her mother will be conducted in the coming month to know about her future planning.

Medical Assessment:

Health wise Sabina and Sajina are fine and their appetite is also good. When first brought to the shelter Sabina weighed 14 kg and now she weighs 17 kg while Sajina then weighed 15 kg and now she weighs 19 kg. Sabina was taken to the hospital only once in April as she had a boil in her tongue. But this was a normal thing in children and she was just given an ointment to be applied. Similarly Sajina was also taken to the hospital once in May as she had a sore in her vagina. This was also reported to be a minor case and she was told to keep the area clean and apply an ointment. Urine test was also conducted that time and the result came normal. This year both of them were given MMR (Mumps, Measles, Rubella) and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination.

2. Name: Rabina BK

Educational and Extra curricular Assessment:

Rabina is average in her studies and got 91.5 % in her first term exam and 93.33 % in second term. There is no complain from her teachers. She is quite active in the shelter and participates in whatever comes up. However she is bit lazy and does not show interest in studies after she returns from home.

Family Assessment:

Rabina's mother is in contact with Saathi. She works in a Catering Company as a helper. She is staying single with her friend. She keeps constant contact with her child. However we have still not been able to establish contact with her father.

Medical Assessment:

Rabina weighed 12 kg when she was first brought to the shelter while now she weighs 16 kg. Rabina is very healthy and has not fallen sick throughout the year. She was examined during the annual check up and was referred for MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination.

3. Name: Bimala Tamang

Educational and Extracurricular Assessment:

She is also very good in her studies and got 99 % in her first term exam and 96 % in second term. She is a bit naughty and is careless at times.

Family Assessment:

Bimala's father is still bedridden with kidney problem. Her mother's income is very low and cannot support husband's medical expenses. Her father desperately needs medical support and Saathi is also trying to arrange for this. Any kind of support for his father is most welcome. Mother also needs a proper job as she works as a rag picker which is very risky job. Mother keeps in constant touch with the child.

Medical Assessment:

Bimala weighed 15 kg in the beginning and now she weighs 18 kg. Health wise she was perfectly fine throughout the year. During the annual check up she was referred for MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination.

4. Name: Menuka Tamang

Educational & Extra Curricular Assessment

Menuka is a well disciplined girl. She received 99 % in her first term exam and 98.16 % in second term. She likes dancing and takes part actively in dance programs.

Family Assessment

Her family's economic condition has still not improved and she will need long term shelter. Her mother keeps constant contact with the child and also takes her home in long holidays. Menuka's younger brother is of now age to start school. Scholarship support for her younger brother is most welcome.

Medical Assessment:

Menuka weighed 15 kg when first brought to the shelter and now she weighs 18 kg. Menuka while in the shelter was sick with fever and cough in September and had to be given antibiotics for seven days. She soon recovered and was perfectly fine. She too was given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination this year.

5. Name: Pramila Bhandari:

Education and Extra Curricular Assessment:

She got 99.33 % in her first term exam and 89.66 % in second term. She is also very good in dancing and takes part in this activity without feeling shy.

Family Assessment

Her mother's single income is still not enough to support Pramila's elder brother Educational support which was provided by another organization for her brother have stopped. As a result they have now started going to school. This is also very difficult. Scholarship support can be provided for her brothers.

Family assessment visit also revealed that her step mother's family is also in dire need of support. She has 4 children with only one child provided support by her grandparents. Her other 3 children are in dire need of support. Saathi is thinking of reserving the youngest child who is 7 years old and bringing her to CK shelter. Her mother keeps constant touch with the child.

Medical Assessment:

Pramila weighed 15 kg when she first came to the shelter and now she weighs 20 kg. She is very healthy and was fine throughout the year. During the annual check up she too was referred for MMR and Japanese Encephalitis Vaccination.

6. Name: Kusum K.C.

Education and Extra Curricular Assessment:

She got 98.85 % in her first term exam and 99.14 % in second term. Kusum is an average girl and is quite sincere in whatever she does.

Family Assessment:

Kusum's mother keeps in constant touch with her child. Her father who had been in the rehabilitation centre now stays in the rented room with his wife. Kusum's mother was not able to pay the fees of the rehabilitation centre. Moreover her father was also not keen on staying in a rehab. He now also takes drugs. Kusum's mother has been running a mobile shop for a living.

Medical Assessment:

Kusum weighed 12 kg when she first came to the shelter and now she weighs 15 kg. Kusum most of time looks pale and she also does not have good appetite. As her father is HIV affected, she was also sent for HIV test from the shelter. Her report came negative.

During the annual health check up the doctor advised giving her vitamins and also appetite increasing syrup. She was also suspected to be anemic and it was also advised to add protein and more fruits in her diet. As of now Kusum is fine and her appetite has also increased. She now eats well. Kusum was taken to Hospital three times this year. In April she had skin allergy for which she was given an ointment to be applied for one week. In June she had a boil in her throat and she was given medicine for tonsils. In September she again had fever and cough for which she was given medicine for five days.

Kusum as such is given special attention where health matters are concerned. She was given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination this year.

7. Name: Ranjana Karki

Education & Extracurricular Assessment:

Ranjana has been studying in class 5 in a government school. Ranjana is a very hard working girl but it has been very difficult for her to cope with schooling as she had never before been to formal schooling. Ranjana did not do well in her first term and her second term result is still not out. Ranjana infact is very weak to be in class 5. Looking at her progress in the class a decision has to be made regarding her future. Ranjana will be sent for skill development training if she is unable to take study pressure.

Family Assessment:

No contact has been established with her family. However Saathi is trying to take her village in Udaypur during her winter vacation. As for now Ranjana has no family as guardian to visit her.

Medical Assessment:

Ranjana weighed 36 kg in the beginning while now she weighs 38 kg. Ranjana looked sick and also always complained of stomach ache. In July she was taken to the Hospital for thorough check up and also had her ultrasound. The ultrasound report was fine and no major abnormality was detected. She was suspected to have stomach ache because of emotional disturbance. She was then referred to the counselor. She is now perfectly fine and her stomach aches have also disappeared. She was also referred to the gynecologist in the women shelter for thorough check up.

In May she was also taken to the Eye Hospital as she complained of headache everyday. Her eyes were examined to be weak and she was given a power glass. Ranjana looks fine now and her headache and stomach pain have also disappeared. She was only given the Japanese Encephalitis vaccination this year.

8. Name: Bhagwati Awasti

Education and Extracurricular Assessment:

She got 94.66 % in her first term exam and gets 94.16 % in second term. She is average in her studies. She is very talkative and cannot stay in a place for long. As such she sometimes disturbs the class.

Family Assessment:

Bhagwati's mother now lives & works in her village in Dhading. The last time she came and visited her daughter was in Dashain in October. Her other sisters also live in a shelter run by another organization (Shakti Milan Samaj Kendra).

Medical Assessment:

Bhagwati weighed 14 kg when she first came to the shelter and now she weighs 17 kg. She was fine throughout the year and was taken to a dermatologist only once in September as she had a skin disease. She was given a special shampoo and a medicine to be applied. She too was given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis Vaccination.

9. Name: Sabina Shrestha

Education and Extra Curricular Assessment:

She got 96.66 % in her first term exam and gets 96.33 % in second term. Sabina is a hardworking girl and is average in her studies.

Family Assessment:

Sabina's father still works as a wage worker and her mother as a beggar. Her mother is a drunkard and does not take care of her younger brother who is 3 years now. She however has been visiting Sabina in long holidays and also takes her during these period. Her brother also needs scholarship support once he starts schooling.

Medical Assessment:

Sabina weighed 15 kg when she first came and now she weighs 18 kg. Health wise she is perfectly fine and was taken to the Hospital only once in May as she was suspected to have urine infection. Her urine culture was done that time and the report came normal. She was examined to have gastric and was given medicine accordingly. Since then she is fine and has not complained of stomach pain. She was also given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination this year.

10. Name: Rashmi Maharjan

Education & Extracurricular Assessment:

She got 83.60 % in her first term exam and gets 88.75 % in second term. Rashmi is also a very hardworking girl and has coped well in her school. Rashmi loves dancing and actively participates in dance programs.

Family Assessment:

Rashmi's father & mother now again have started living together. However her father still drinks and does not work and earn. Her mother has difficulty running home with her income alone. Her mother's is low and requires scholarship support for Rashmi's younger sister. She has contacted Saathi time and again support for the young child. Shelter pays frequent visit to Rashmi.

Medical Assessment:

Rashmi weighed 25 kg when she first came to the shelter and now she weighs 30 kg. Rashmi has a good appetite and also remained healthy throughout the year. She was once referred to the eye hospital in May as she complained of headache. However after examination it was known that she did not need a power glass. She too was given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination.

11. Name: Akansha B.C.

Education and Extra Curricular Assessment:

She got 97.33 % in her first term exam and 96.66 % in second term. Akansha is a quiet and shy girl and does not participate much in extra activity. She is however is encouraged to become more participative.

Family Assessment:

Akansha's family comes from Surkhet. Therefore assessment has not been conducted there. However her mother took her during the Dashain holiday and she also calls Akansha regularly.

Medical Assessment:

Akansha was 15 kg in the beginning and now she weighs 17 kg. While in the shelter she was taken to Hospital twice. In June she had cold and cough and was given medicine accordingly while in August she was again sick with cold and cough and vomiting. It was told that she had a gastric problem and she was advised to avoid salty and oily food. She was given medicine for 15 days and now she is perfectly fine. She eats well and takes normal food now. She too was given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination this year.

12. Name: Safina Khadka

Education and Extracurricular Assessment:

Safina has not started schooling. In the coming year she will be sent to play group. As of now Safina has started picking up words but is still not able to form a sentence.

Family Assessment:

Her father works as a wage worker and lives completely in the street. He spends whatever he earns in drinking. Her mother had a serious mental problem and she was sent to a village in her sister's house. Her well being after that is not known. She needs health support but this support is costly. Her father visits her only sometimes.

Medical Assessment:

Safina was a case of mal nutrition. She was placed in a centre run by another organization for malnourished children for two weeks before bringing her to Saathi. She weighed 7.1 kg when first brought to the shelter and now she weighs 11 kg. She still needs to add on weight. While in the shelter Safina was

taken to hospital once as she has fever and cough. She was then given a cough syrup. Safina is fine now and she was also MMR vaccination this year.

13. Name: Rejina Demdung

Education and Extracurricular Assessment:

She got 94.5 % in her first term exam and 97.87 % in second term. Rejina is an average girls and is bit naughty at times.

Family Assessment:

According to sources Rejina's father who had gone missing, has gone Gulf country for work. However there is no support from the father for the family. It is difficult for the mother to look after the entire family with her income. She has 3 elder sisters and one younger sister. Saathi is thinking of rescuing her younger sister who is 6 year old after the expansion of the CK shelter. Her mother keeps in constant contact and takes her during long holidays.

Medical Assessment:

Rejina weighed 15 kg in the beginning and now she weighs 20 kg. She is very healthy and did not fall sick throughout the year. She was also given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination this year.

14. Name: Sita Rokaya

Education and Extracurricular Assessment:

She got 58.66 % in her first term exam and 86.66 % in second term. Sita initially was very weak in studies as she did not even understand Nepali properly. The village that she came from had their own dialect. But now she is doing better and has also started communicating. Sita is also shy and does not participate much in extra activity.

Family Assessment:

Sita's father lives in the village but her brother who works as a domestic worker in Kathmandu pays constant visit to her. Her family assessment in the village has not been done.

Medical Assessment:

When first brought to the shelter she weighed 10 kg and now she weighs 15 kg. She is healthy and has a good appetite. She has not fallen sick throughout the year. She too was given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination.

15. Name: Smriti Devkota

Education and Extracurricular Assessment:

She got 93 % in her first term exam as well as in the second term. Smriti is an average girl and also is well disciplined.

Family Assessment:

Smriti's mother still works as a domestic worker. She is a single parent. Her mother have a heart related problem and epilepsy. She while going for work lives Smriti's younger sister alone in the room. Physically also she looks pale and Saathi this year will reserve her younger sister and bring her to the CK shelter.

Medical Assessment:

She weighed 20 kg when first brought to the shelter and now she weighs 17 kg. She is the only one who has lost weight after coming to the shelter. She looks healthy but she is not a keen eater. She will be referred to a doctor soon. She however did not fall sick throughout the year. She was given the MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination.

16. Name: Nisa Gurung

Education and Extracurricular Assessment:

She got 82.33 % in her first term exam and 94.66 % in second term. Nisa is a shy girl and does not talk much. She is also very shy when asked to join other children while dancing.

Family Assessment:

Nisa's mother is deaf and dumb and lives and begs on the street. Her mother never visits her, however she is seen around in the Pashupati temple area. She needs a long term shelter as she has been abused in the street time and again.

Medical Assessment:

Nisa weighed 15 kg when first brought to the shelter and now she weighs 20 kg. Nisa has good appetite and eats well. During the annual check up Nisa was referred for a minor operation as she had her tongue tied which would result in speech defect. This operation will take place in the coming year after consultation with other doctors as well. Nisa while in the shelter was taken to the Hospital only once in November as she had fever and dry cough. Her X-ray

was also taken then but no problem was detected. She was given medicine for one week. Nisa too was given MMR and Japanese Encephalitis vaccination this year.

17. Name: Samiksha Rai

Education and Extra Curricular Assessment:

She got 47.83 % in her first term exam and missed her second term. Samiksha is still very young and it has been difficult for her to catch up things. She missed her second term as her mother did not drop her on time after the Dashain holiday.

Family Assessment:

Samiksha's mother took her during the Dashain break for holiday. But she did not drop Samiksha till December last. However after constant follow up, we got to know that her mother left her rented room. She could not pay the rent. It was then known that she went back to the village taking her children along.

Medical Assessment:

Samiksha weighed 10 kg when she first came and also looked pale. But within a month she gained weight and now weighs 15 kg. Her appetite was good and she became sick only once in August with high fever and stomach pain. The doctor suggested to have her blood tested and the report showed that she had typhoid. She was then accordingly given medicine for 10 days after which she became fine. She missed her MMR vaccination and was given vaccination for only Japanese Encephalitis. She will also soon be referred for the MMR vaccination.
